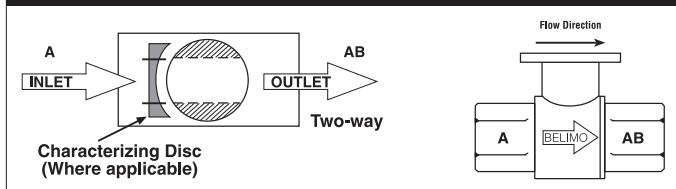

Flow Pattern



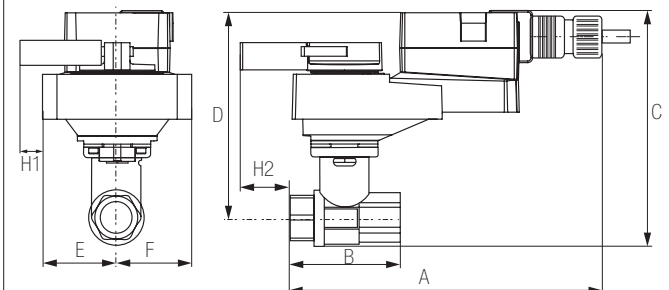
Application

INSTALLATION NOTES

-  Actuators with appliance cables are numbered.
-  Provide overload protection and disconnect as required.
-  Two built-in auxiliary switches (2x SPDT), for end position indication, interlock control, fan startup, etc.
-  Actuators may be powered in parallel. Power consumption must be observed.
-  Parallel wiring required for piggy-back applications.
-  Apply only AC line voltage or only UL-Class 2 voltage to the terminals of auxiliary switches. Mixed or combined operation of line voltage/safety extra low voltage is not allowed.
-  Meets cULus requirements without the need of an electrical ground connection.
